Whereas, this ordinance constitutes an emergency measure providing for the usual daily operation of a municipal department; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the Council of the City of Cleveland:

Section 1. That the following sections of the Codified Ordinances of Cleveland, Ohio, 1976:

Section 401.05, as amended by Ordinance No. 1459-78, passed November 22, 1978,

Section 401.23, as amended by Ordinance No. 1684-76, passed June 29, 1976,

Section 401.25, as amended by Ordinance No. 1459-78, passed November 22, 1978,

Section 401.26, as amended by Ordinance No. 835-03, passed June 10, 2003,

Section 2. That Section 401.101, as amended by Ordinance No. 835-03, passed June 10, 2003, relating to Commercial Motor Vehicle, is repealed.

Section 401.03 Alley

"Alley" means a street or highway intended to provide access to the rear or side of lots or buildings in urban districts and not intended for the purpose of through vehicular traffic, and includes any street or highway that has been declared an "alley" by the legislative authority of the municipal corporation in which the street or highway is located.
(RC 4511.01(XX))

Section 401.031 Arterial Street

"Arterial street" means any United States or state numbered route, controlled access highway, or other major radial or circumferential street or highway designated by local authorities within their respective jurisdictions as part of a major arterial system of streets or highways.
(RC 4511.01(CCC))

Section 401.041 Beacon

"Beacon" means a highway traffic signal with one (1) or more signal sections that operate in a flashing mode.
(RC 4511.01(KKK))

Section 401.05 Bicycle

"Bicycle" means every device, other than a device that is designed solely for use as a play vehicle by a child, that is propelled solely by human power upon which a person may ride, and that has two (2) or more wheels, any of which is more than fourteen (14) inches in diameter.
(RC 4511.01(G))

Section 401.081 Child Day-Care Center and Type A Family Day-Care Home

"Child day-care center" and "type A family day-care home" have the same meanings as in RC 5104.01.
(RC 4511.01(FFF))

Section 401.161 Explosives

"Explosives" means any chemical compound or mechanical mixture that is intended for the purpose of producing an explosion that contains any oxidizing and combustible units or other ingredients in such proportions, quantities, or packing that an ignition by fire, by friction, by concussion, by percussion, or by a detonator of any part of the compound or mixture may cause such a sudden generation of highly heated gases that the resultant gaseous pressures are capable of producing destructive effects on contiguous objects, or of destroying life or limb. Manufactured articles shall not be held to be explosives when the individual units contain explosives in such limited quantities, of such nature, or in such packing, that it is impossible to procure a simultaneous or a destructive explosion of such units, to the injury of life, limb, or property by fire, by friction, by concussion, by percussion, or by a detonator, such as fixed ammunition for small arms, firecrackers, or safety fuse matches.
(RC 4511.01(T))

Section 401.171 Flammable Liquid

"Flammable liquid" means any liquid that has a flash point of seventy degrees Fahrenheit (70°F), or less, as determined by a tagliabue or equivalent closed cup test device.
(RC 4511.01(U))

Section 401.201 Highway Maintenance Vehicle

"Highway maintenance vehicle" means a vehicle used in snow and ice removal or road surface maintenance, including a snow plow, traffic line striper, road sweeper, mowing machine, asphalt distributing vehicle, or other such vehicle designed for use in specific highway maintenance activities.
(RC 4511.01(QQQ))

Section 401.202 Highway Traffic Signal

"Highway traffic signal" means a power-operated traffic control device by which traffic is warned or directed to take some specific action. "Highway traffic signal" does not include a power-operated sign, steadily illuminated pavement marker, warning light, or steady burning electric lamp.
(RC 4511.01(MMM))

Section 401.23 Median

"Median" means the area between two (2) roadways of a divided highway, measured from edge of traveled way to edge of traveled way, but excluding turn lanes. The width of a median may be different between intersections, between interchanges, and at opposite approaches of the same intersection.
(RC 4511.01(NNN))

Section 401.25 Motor Vehicle

"Motor vehicle" means every vehicle propelled or drawn by power other than muscular power or power collected from overhead electric trolley wires, except motorized bicycles, road rollers, traction engines, power shovels, power cranes, and other equipment used in construction work and not designed for or employed in general highway transportation, hole-digging machinery, well-drilling machinery, ditch-digging machinery, farm machinery, and trailers designed and used exclusively to transport a boat between a place of storage and a marina, or in and around a marina, when drawn or towed on a street or highway for a distance of no more than ten (10) miles and at a speed of twenty-five (25) miles per hour or less.
(RC 4511.01(B))

Section 405.26 Motorcycle

"Motorcycle" means every motor vehicle, other than a tractor, having a seat or saddle for the use of the operator and designed to travel on not more than three (3) wheels in contact with the ground, including, but not limited, to motor vehicles known as "motor-driven cycle," "motor scooter," "cab-enclosed motorcycle," or "motorcycle" without regard to weight or brake horsepower.
(RC 4511.01(C))

Section 401.261 Motorized Bicycle

"Motorized bicycle" means any vehicle that either has two (2) tandem wheels or one (1) wheel in the front and two (2) wheels in the rear, that is capable of being pedaled, and that is equipped with a helper motor of not more than fifty (50) cubic centimeters piston displacement that produces no more than one (1) brake horsepower and is capable of propelling the vehicle at a speed of no greater than twenty (20) miles per hour on a level surface.
(RC 4501.01(L))

Section 401.262 Motorized Wheelchair

"Motorized wheelchair" means any self-propelled vehicle designed for, and used by, a handicapped person and that is incapable of a speed in excess of eight (8) miles per hour.
(RC 4511.01(EEE))

Section 401.263 Multi-Wheel Agricultural Tractor

"Multi-wheel agricultural tractor" means a type of agricultural tractor that has two (2) or more wheels or tires on each side of one (1) axle at the rear of the tractor, is designed or used for drawing other vehicles or wheeled machinery, has no provision for carrying loads independently of the drawn vehicles or machinery, and is used principally for agricultural purposes.
(RC 4511.01(GGG))

Section 401.291 Operate

"Operate" means to cause or have caused movement of a vehicle, streetcar, or trackless trolley.
(RC 4511.01(HHH))

Section 401.331 Parking Meter Zone

"Parking meter zone" means any section of a street or highway where parking meters are installed adjacent to the curb.

Section 401.401 Predicate Motor Vehicle or Traffic Offense

"Predicate motor vehicle or traffic offense" means any of the following:

(a) A violation of RC 4511.03, 4511.051, 4511.12, 4511.132, 4511.16, 4511.20, 4511.201, 4511.21, 4511.211, 4511.213, 4511.22, 4511.23, 4511.25, 4511.26, 4511.27, 4511.28, 4511.29, 4511.30, 4511.31, 4511.32, 4511.33, 4511.34, 4511.35, 4511.36, 4511.37, 4511.38, 4511.39, 4511.40, 4511.41, 4511.42, 4511.43, 4511.431, 4511.432, 4511.44, 4511.441, 4511.451, 4511.452, 4511.46, 4511.47, 4511.48, 4511.481, 4511.49, 4511.50, 4511.511, 4511.53, 4511.54, 4511.55, 4511.56, 4511.57, 4511.58, 4511.59, 4511.60, 4511.61, 4511.64, 4511.66, 4511.661, 4511.68, 4511.70, 4511.701, 4511.71, 4511.711, 4511.712, 4511.713, 4511.72, 4511.73, 4511.763, 4511.771, 4511.78 or 4511.84;

(b) A violation of RC 4511.17(A)(2), 4511.51(A) to (D) or 4511.74(A);

(c) A violation of any provision of RC 4511.01 to 4511.76 for which no penalty otherwise is provided in the section that contains the provision violated;

(d) A violation of any section of this Traffic Code that is substantially equivalent to any section or provision set forth or described in division (a), (b) or (c) of this section;

(e) Effective January 1, 2017, a violation of RC 4511.214;

(f) Effective January 1, 2017, a violation of a municipal ordinance that is substantially similar to any section or provision set forth or described in division RC 4511.01 (III) (1), (2), (3) or (5).
(RC 4511.01(III))

Section 401.402 Private Road Open to Public Travel

"Private road open to public travel" means a private toll road or road, including any adjacent sidewalks that generally run parallel to the road, within a shopping center, airport, sports arena, or other similar business or recreation facility that is privately owned but where the public is allowed to travel without access

restrictions. "Private road open to public travel" includes a gated toll road but does not include a road within a private gated property where access is restricted at all times, a parking area, a driving aisle within a parking area, or a private grade crossing.
(RC 4511.01(OOO))

Section 401.43 Public Safety Vehicle
"Public safety vehicle" means any of the following:

(a) Ambulances, including private ambulance companies under contract to a municipal corporation, township, or county, and private ambulances and nontransport vehicles bearing license plates issued under RC 4503.49.

(b) Motor vehicles used by public law enforcement officers or other persons sworn to enforce the criminal and traffic laws of the state.

(c) Any motor vehicle when properly identified as required by the Ohio Director of Public Safety, when used in response to fire emergency calls or to provide emergency medical service to ill or injured persons, and when operated by a duly qualified person who is a member of a volunteer rescue service or a volunteer fire department, and who is on duty pursuant to the rules or directives of that service. The State Fire Marshal shall be designated by the Ohio Director of Public Safety as the certifying agency for all public safety vehicles described in this division (c).

(d) Vehicles used by fire departments, including motor vehicles when used by volunteer firefighters responding to emergency calls in the fire department service when identified as required by the Ohio Director of Public Safety.

Any vehicle used to transport or provide emergency medical service to an ill or injured person, when certified as a public safety vehicle, shall be considered a public safety vehicle when transporting an ill or injured person to a hospital, regardless of whether the vehicle has already passed a hospital.

(e) Vehicles used by the motor carrier enforcement unit for the enforcement of orders and rules of the Public Utilities Commission as specified in RC 5503.34.
(RC 4511.01(E))

Section 401.481 Ridesharing Arrangement

"Ridesharing arrangement" means the transportation of persons in a motor vehicle where such transportation is incidental to another purpose of a volunteer driver and includes ridesharing arrangements known as carpools, vanpools, and buspools.
(RC 4511.01(DDD))

Section 401.491 Road Service Vehicle

"Road service vehicle" means wreckers, utility repair vehicles, and state, county and municipal service vehicles equipped with visual signals by means of flashing, rotating or oscillating lights.
(RC 4511.01(JJJ))

Section 401.531 Shared-Use Path

"Shared-use path" means a bikeway outside the traveled way and physically separated from motorized vehicular traffic by an open space or barrier and either within the highway right-of-way or within an independent alignment. A shared-use path

also may be used by pedestrians, including skaters, joggers, users of manual and motorized wheelchairs, and other authorized motorized and non-motorized users.
(RC 4511.01(PPP))

Section 401.561 State Highway

"State highway" means a highway under the jurisdiction of the Ohio Department of Transportation, outside the limits of municipal corporations, provided that the authority conferred upon the Ohio Director of Transportation in RC 5511.01 to erect state highway route markers and signs directing traffic shall not be modified by RC 4511.01 to 4511.79 and 4511.99.
(RC 4511.01(II))

Section 401.67 Traffic Control Device

"Traffic control device" means a flagger, sign, signal, marking, or other device used to regulate, warn, or guide traffic, placed on, over, or adjacent to a street, highway, private road open to public travel, pedestrian facility, or shared-use path by authority of a public agency or official having jurisdiction, or, in the case of a private road open to public travel, by authority of the private owner or private official having jurisdiction.
(RC 4511.01(QQ))

Section 401.68 Traffic Control Signal

"Traffic control signal" means any highway traffic signal by which traffic is alternately directed to stop and permitted to proceed.
(RC 4511.01(RR))

Section 401.69 Trailer

"Trailer" means every vehicle designed or used for carrying persons or property wholly on its own structure and for being drawn by a motor vehicle, including any vehicle when formed by or operated as a combination of a "semitrailer" and a vehicle of the dolly type, such as that commonly known as a "trailer dolly," a vehicle used to transport agricultural produce or agricultural production materials between a local place of storage or supply and the farm when drawn or towed on a street or highway at a speed greater than twenty-five (25) miles per hour, and a vehicle designed and used exclusively to transport a boat between a place of storage and a marina, or in and around a marina, when drawn or towed on a street or highway for a distance of more than ten (10) miles or at a speed of more than twenty-five (25) miles per hour.
(RC 4511.01(M))

"Automatically operated gate" means any mechanical device placed or erected within a Municipal parking facility, as defined in section 401.27, for the regulation of parking, so designed that a gate across the exit or entrance of such parking facility automatically raises to allow a single vehicle to be moved through the exit or entrance upon the deposit in such gate of coins or parking tokens, or upon the insertion in such gate of a parking key or parking card, as indicated on the automatically operated gate.

Section 401.06 Bus

"Bus" means every motor vehicle designed for carrying more than nine (9) passengers and used for the transportation of persons other than in a ridesharing arrangement, as defined in section 401.481, and every motor vehicle, automobile for hire, or funeral car, other than a taxicab or motor vehicle used in a ridesharing arrangement, designed and used for the transportation of persons for compensation.
(RC 4511.01(L))

Section 401.07 Business District

"Business district" means the territory fronting upon a street or highway, including the street or highway, between successive intersections within municipal corporations where fifty percent (50%) or more of the frontage between such successive intersections is occupied by buildings in use for business, or within or outside municipal corporations where fifty percent (50%) or more of the frontage for a distance of three hundred (300) feet or more is occupied by buildings in use for business, and the character of such territory is indicated by official traffic control devices.
(RC 4511.01(NN))

Section 401.10 Commercial Car or Truck

"Commercial car" or "truck" means any motor vehicle that has motor power and is designed and used for carrying merchandise or freight, or that is used as a commercial tractor.
(RC 4501.01(J))

Section 401.14 Crosswalk

"Crosswalk" means:

(a) That part of a roadway at intersections ordinarily included within the real or projected prolongation of property lines and curb lines or, in the absence of curbs, the edges of the traversable roadway;

(b) Any portion of a roadway at an intersection or elsewhere, distinctly indicated for pedestrian crossing by lines or other markings on the surface;

(c) Notwithstanding divisions (a) and (b) of this section, there shall not be a crosswalk where local authorities have placed signs indicating no crossing.
(RC 4511.01(LL))

Section 401.21 Intersection

"Intersection" means

(a) The area embraced within the prolongation or connection of the lateral curb lines, or, if none, then the lateral boundary lines of the roadways of two (2) highways that join

one another at, or approximately at, right angles, or the area within which vehicles traveling upon different highways that join at any other angle might come into conflict. The junction of an alley or driveway with a roadway or highway does not constitute an intersection unless the roadway or highway at the junction is controlled by a traffic control device.

(b) If a highway includes two (2) roadways that are thirty (30) feet or more apart, then every crossing of each roadway of such divided highway by an intersecting highway constitutes a separate intersection. If both intersecting highways include two (2) roadways thirty (30) feet or more apart, then every crossing of any two (2) roadways of such highways constitutes a separate intersection.

(c) At a location controlled by a traffic control signal, regardless of the distance between the separate intersections as described in division (b) of this section.

(1) If a stop line, yield line, or crosswalk has not been designated on the roadway within the median between the separate intersections, the two (2) intersections and the roadway and median constitute one (1) intersection.

(2) Where a stop line, yield line, or crosswalk line is designated on the roadway on the intersection approach, the area within the crosswalk and any area beyond the designated stop line or yield line constitute part of the intersection.

(3) Where a crosswalk is designated on a roadway on the departure from the intersection, the intersection includes the area that extends to the far side of the crosswalk.
(RC 4511.01(KK))

Section 401.61 Street or Highway

"Street" or "highway" are synonymous and mean the entire width between the boundary lines of every way open to the use of the public as a thoroughfare for purposes of vehicular travel.

(RC 4511.01(BB))

Section 401.66 Traffic

"Traffic" means pedestrians, ridden or herded animals, vehicles, streetcars, trackless trolleys, and other devices, either singly or together, while using for purposes of travel any highway or private road open to public travel.

(RC 4511.01(TT))

Section 401.73 Vehicle

"Vehicle" means every device, including a motorized bicycle, in, upon, or by which any person or property may be transported or drawn upon a highway, except that "vehicle" does not include any motorized wheelchair, any electric personal assistive mobility device, any device that is moved by power collected from overhead electric trolley wires or that is used exclusively upon stationary rails or tracks, or any device, other than a bicycle, that is moved by human power.

This ordinance constitutes the additional legislative authority required by Ordinance No. 702-13 to exercise this option.

That the Director of Capital Projects is authorized to issue one or more permits, revocable at the will of Council, to Crown Castle NG East LLC, 2000 Corporate Drive, Canonburg, PA 15317 ("Permittee") to encroach into various public rights-of-way within the City of Cleveland by installing, using, and maintaining distributed antenna system nodes to be attached to Cleveland Public Power, the Illuminating Company, and AT&T utility poles (by separate permission of the poles' owners), and by installing, using, and maintaining duct banks connecting existing AT&T manholes and ground or pole cabinets for the nodes. The permit(s) shall not be issued until the Manager of the Division of Engineering and Construction and the Director of Capital Projects have first reviewed and approved each specific node and duct bank encroachment location that Permittee requests.

Section 2. That Permittee may assign a permit only with the written consent of the Director of Capital Projects. That nothing in this ordinance grants or shall be considered to grant to Permittee any right, privilege, or permission to use, or to attach or affix any object to, poles; Permittee shall obtain such permission from the respective pole owner.

Section 3. That the encroaching objects permitted by this ordinance shall conform to plans and specifications first approved by the Manager of Engineering and Construction. That Permittee shall obtain all other required permits, including but not limited to Building Permits, before installing the encroachments.

Section 4. That the Director of Law shall prepare the permit(s) authorized by this ordinance and shall incorporate such additional provisions as the director determines necessary to protect and benefit the public interest. The permit(s) shall be issued only when, in the opinion of the Director of Law, a prospective Permittee has properly indemnified the City against any loss that may result from the encroachment(s) permitted.

Section 5. That the Permit shall reserve reasonable right of entry to the encroachment locations to the City.

Section 6. That this ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure and, provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

St. Clair Avenue, 2nd Floor, Cleveland, OH 44113 ("Permittee") to encroach into the public right-of-way at various locations in the City of Cleveland by installing, using, and maintaining fiber optic cable, duct banks, and vaults to be attached to Cleveland Public Power utility poles. The permit(s) authorized shall not be issued until the Manager of the Division of Engineering and Construction and the Director of Capital Projects have first reviewed and approved each specific encroachment location that the Permittee requests.

Section 2. That Permittee may assign a permit only with the prior written consent of the Director of Capital Projects. That nothing in this ordinance grants or shall be considered to grant to Permittee any right, privilege, or permission to use, or to attach or affix any object to poles; Permittee shall obtain such permission from the respective pole owner.

Section 3. That the encroaching objects permitted by this ordinance shall conform to plans and specifications first approved by the Manager of Engineering and Construction. That Permittee shall obtain all other required permits, including but not limited to Building Permits, before installing the encroachments.

Section 4. That the Director of Law shall prepare the permit authorized by this ordinance and shall incorporate such additional provisions as the director determines necessary to protect and benefit the public interest. The permit shall be issued only when, in the opinion of the Director of Law, a prospective Permittee has properly indemnified the City against any loss that may result from the encroachment(s) permitted.

Section 5. That the permit shall reserve reasonable right of entry to the encroachment location to the City.

Section 6. That this ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure and, provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

An emergency ordinance giving consent of the City of Cleveland to the Ohio Department of Transportation to install traffic signals at the east-bound I-90 exit ramp to Chester Avenue in the City of Cleveland and operate the ramp as part of the existing signalized intersection of East 30th Street and Chester Avenue; and authorizing the Director of Capital Projects to enter into any relative agreements.

Whereas, this ordinance constitutes an emergency measure providing for the usual daily operation of a municipal department; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the Council of the City of Cleveland:

Section 1. That it is declared to be in the public interest that the consent of the City of Cleveland is given to the Director of Transportation of the State of Ohio ("the State") to construct the following improvement under plans, specifications, and estimates approved by the State: to install traffic signals at the east-bound I-90 exit ramp to Chester Avenue in the City of Cleveland and operate the ramp as part of the existing signalized intersection of East 30th Street and Chester Avenue (the "Improvement").

Section 2. That the City gives its consent to the Improvement and its administration by the State. The entire cost and expense of the Improvement will be provided by the State and this ordinance shall not be construed to impose any financial obligation on the City for the Improvement. However, the City agrees to assume and contribute 100% of the cost of any items included in the construction contract, at the request of the City, which are determined by the State and Federal Highway Administration to be not eligible or made necessary by the Improvement.

Section 3. That the Director of Capital Projects is authorized to enter into one or more agreements with the State necessary to complete the planning and construction of the Improvement, which agreements shall contain terms and conditions that the Director of Law determines shall best protect the public interest.

Section 4. (a) That all existing streets and public rights-of-way within the City that are necessary for the Improvement shall be made available.

(b) That the City agrees that all right-of-way required for the Improvement will be acquired and/or made available in accordance with current State and Federal regulations. The City also understands that right-of-way costs include eligible utility costs.

(c) That arrangements have been or will be made with and agreements obtained from all utility companies whose lines or structures will be affected by the Improvement. That the companies have agreed to make any and all necessary rearrangements in such manner as to be clear of any construction called for by the plans for the Improvement. That the companies have agreed to make necessary rearrangements immediately after notification by the City or the State.

(d) That the installation of all utility facilities on the right-of-way shall

conform with the requirements of Title 23 CFR 645 and the ODOT Utilities Manual.

Section 5. That upon completion of the Improvement, and unless otherwise agreed, the City shall:

(a) provide adequate maintenance of the Improvement under all applicable state and federal law, including but not limited to, 23 USC 116;

(b) provide ample financial provisions, as necessary for the maintenance of the Improvement;

(c) maintain the right-of-way-keeping it free of obstructions, and

(d) hold the right-of-way inviolate for public highway purposes.

Section 6. That this Council requests the State to proceed with the Improvement.

Section 7. That the Clerk of Council is authorized and directed to transmit to the State three (3) certified copies of this ordinance immediately on its taking effect, and it shall become the basis for proceeding with the Improvement.

Section 8. That this ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure and, provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

Be it ordained by the Council of the City of Cleveland:

Section 1. That the Director of Public Works is authorized to make one or more written requirement contracts under the Charter and the Codified Ordinances of Cleveland, Ohio, 1976, for requirements for a term of one year or two years for the necessary items of recycled or virgin asphalt concrete in the approximate amount as purchased during the preceding term, purchased by the Commissioner of Purchases and Supplies upon a unit basis for the Division of Streets, Department of Public Works. Bids shall be taken in a manner that permits an award to be made for all items as a single contract, or by separate contract for each or any combination of the items as the Board of Control determines. Alternate bids for a period less than the specified term may be taken if desired by the Commissioner of Purchases and Supplies until provision is made for the requirements for the entire term. The Director of Public Works is authorized to enter into one or more contracts with a term of two years instead of one year when there is a financial advantage to the City. For purposes of this ordinance, a financial advantage shall be determined by the Director of Public Works by

comparing the bids received for both terms.

Section 2. That the costs of the contract or contracts shall be paid from the fund or funds to which are credited the proceeds from the sale of bonds, if issued for this purpose, and shall also be charged against the proper appropriation accounts and the Director of Finance shall certify the amount of any purchase under the contract, each of which purchases shall be made on order of the Commissioner of Purchases and Supplies by a delivery order issued against the contract or contracts and certified by the Director of Finance. (RQN 7016, RL 2015-33)

Section 3. That under Section 108(b) of the Charter, the purchases authorized by this ordinance may be made through cooperative arrangements with other governmental agencies. The Director of Public Works may sign all documents that are necessary to make the purchases, and may enter into one or more contracts with the vendors selected through that cooperative process.

Section 4. That this ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure and, provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

Referred to Directors of Public Works, Finance, Law; Committees on Municipal Properties and Services, Finance.

Whereas, this ordinance constitutes an emergency measure providing for the usual daily operation of a municipal department; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the Council of the City of Cleveland:

Section 1. That, under Section 167 of the Charter of the City of Cleveland, this Council determines to make the public improvement of replacing the bridge and renovating the irrigation system at Highland Park Golf Course, including making site improvements, for the Department of Public Works or Capital Projects, as appropriate, by one or more contracts duly let to the lowest responsible bidder or bidders after competitive bidding for a gross price for the improvement.

Section 2. That the Director of Public Works or Capital Projects, as appropriate, is authorized to enter into one or more contracts for the making of the public improvement with the lowest responsible bidder or bidders after competitive bidding for a gross price for the improvement, provided, however, that each separate trade and each distinct component part of the improvement may be treated as a separate improvement, and each, or any combination, of the

trades or components may be the subject of a separate contract for a gross price. On request of the appropriate director, the contractor shall furnish a correct schedule of unit prices, including profit and overhead, for all items constituting units of the improvement.

Section 3. That the Director of Public Works or Capital Project, as appropriate, is authorized to apply and pay for permits, licenses, or other authorizations required by any regulatory agency or public authority to permit performance of the work authorized by this ordinance.

Section 4. That the cost of the improvement and other expenditures authorized shall be paid from Fund Nos. 20 SF 516, 20 SF 520, 20 SF 523, 20 SF 528, 20 SF 534, 20 SF 535, 20 SF 538, 20 SF 540, 20 SF 544, 20 SF 546, 20 SF 552, 20 SF 554, 20 SF 558, 20 SF 561, 20 SF 563, 20 SF 565, 20 SF 568, and from the fund or funds approved by the Director of Finance, including those funds to which are credited the proceeds from the sale of future bonds, if authorized for this purpose, Request No. RQS 0103, RL 2016-12.

Section 5. That this ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure and, provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

Whereas, fewer banking institutions offer trustee services for City bonds, certificates of participation and other debt instruments; and

Whereas, the number of local banking institutions offering such trustee services is decreasing; and

Whereas, good practice is to obtain proposals for such services from a number of banking institutions; and

Whereas, in order to obtain proposals from a number of banking institutions, the City must seek proposals outside of the local area;

Whereas, this ordinance constitutes an emergency measure providing for the usual daily operation of a municipal department; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the Council of the City of Cleveland:

Section 1. That Section 178.02 of the Codified Ordinances of Cleveland, Ohio, 1976, as amended by Ordinance No. 1660-04, passed October 11, 2004, is amended to read as follows:

Section 178.02 Disposition of Public Monies

(a) **Except as provided in paragraph (g), all public monies coming under the custody and control of the City Treasurer shall be deposited or invested by the City Treasurer as provided in this chapter. The City Treasurer may retain, however, in the Treasury or in such other offices of the City as may be necessary, such**

amounts of public money as may be needed in the opinion of the Director of Finance to transact the daily business of the Treasury or such offices.

(b) The City Treasurer shall deposit in active deposits such amounts of public monies as are needed in the opinion of the Director of Finance to provide the needed cash flow to pay City warrants and checks issued and outstanding, and a reasonable surplus in addition to the amount needed to pay such warrants and checks. All public monies of the City not deposited in active deposits or retained pursuant to division (a) of this section shall be invested in accordance with Section 178.12 of this chapter.

(c) Each division of the City receiving public monies shall deposit all public monies coming into its custody or control with an eligible depository on the business day next following the day of receipt if the total amount of such monies received exceeds one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00). If the total amount of the monies received does not exceed one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00), the monies shall be deposited on or before the third business day following the day of receipt. Any division of the City depositing public monies shall report such deposit in writing to the City Treasurer within twenty-four (24) hours of making the deposit.

(d) Before noon of each business day, the City Treasurer shall prepare a sworn statement delineating the total amount deposited in each eligible depository of the City during the preceding day, the number and amount of payment instruments issued on each eligible depository during the preceding business day and such other information as required by the Director of Finance. Copies of the statement shall be furnished to the Commissioner of Accounts and the City Controller. All money paid to the Treasurer shall be paid upon the order or draft of the Commissioner of Accounts and receipts therefor shall be given in duplicate, one (1) of which shall have printed on its face the word "original" and the other, the word "duplicate." The duplicates of receipts for money shall be filed with the Commissioner of Accounts and each receipt shall state the amount received, from whom received and to what fund the same is to be applied.

(e) The City Controller shall maintain the records of the amount of deposits made by the City Treasurer with each eligible depository and instruments issued by the City Treasurer on each eligible depository. The City Controller shall duly certify to the correctness of the City Treasurer's daily sworn statements, prepared in accordance with division (c) of this section, if they are found to be correct upon comparison with their respective books. Such sworn statements shall be kept on file in the office of the City Controller. If any such sworn statement is found to be incorrect, the City Controller shall forthwith give notice of such fact to the City Treasurer and the Director of Finance. After the end of each month, the City Controller shall reconcile the statements of the respective eligible depositories to the City Treasurer's daily statements and the City's accounting records. If the accounting records are found to be incorrect, the City Controller shall forthwith give notice of

such fact to the Commissioner of Accounts and the City Treasurer.

(f) The Commissioner of Accounts shall maintain books which will show the cash balance of each fund, and shall issue no warrant payable from any such fund unless there is money belonging thereto for the payment of the warrant in full.

(g) Funds coming into the City's possession as a result of the sale of bonds, certificates of participation, or other debt instruments shall be deposited and invested in accordance with the applicable indenture of trust. Such funds shall be placed with a trustee institution, which institution shall be a depository, as defined in division (d) of Section 178.01, but is not required to be an eligible depository under division (e) of Section 178.01.

Section 2. That existing Section 178.02 of the Codified Ordinances of Cleveland, Ohio, 1976, as amended by Ordinance No. 1660-04, passed October 11, 2004, is repealed.

Section 3. That this ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure and, provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

The amendment shall provide that upon the passage date of this ordinance, the existing leased premises shall be increased by approximately 26,185 square feet ("New Leased Premises"). The rent amount for the approximately 26,185 of additional square feet of the New Leased Premises shall be set by the Board of Control and based upon a fair market value appraisal upon the passage date of this ordinance to January 31, 2024. The rent amount for the entire New Leased Premises from February 1, 2024 to January 31, 2034 shall be set by the Board of Control and based upon a new fair market value appraisal.

Section 2. That the Director of Port Control is authorized to provide for the issuance of rent credits to Corporate Wings Hopkins LLC, dba

Atlantic Aviation for the purpose of making capital improvements to the Leased Premises, subject to the approval of appropriate City officials for said capital improvements. The rent credit amount shall not exceed \$2,642,055, and shall be amortized over the extended term of the agreement. No rent credit shall reduce the minimum annual payment due the City by more than 67%. Any such capital improvements not amortized over such period shall not constitute a rent credit.
